

## **Student Health Advisory Committee (SHAC) Membership Admission Process**

The Student Health Advisory Committee (hereby abbreviated as SHAC) aims to serve as a diverse and balanced representation of the UCSB student body. This committee's objective is to facilitate effective and efficient discussions between representatives of the various student organizations and Student Health leadership.

The committee may consist of the following voting members (one vote per entity) who are student representatives from:

- ❖ The Student Fee Advisory Committee (SFAC)
- ❖ Undergraduate representative from the Executive Oversight Board
- ❖ Graduate representative from the Executive Oversight Board
- ❖ Associated Students (A.S.) Government
- ❖ Recreation Department
- ❖ Intercollegiate Athletics (ICA)
- ❖ Basic Needs Resource Center
- ❖ Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS)
- ❖ Goodspeed Intern
- ❖ The Committee Chairperson
- ❖ Greek Life
- ❖ Health Equity

In addition to this, UCSB students with no affiliation to an organization or program are also permitted to be committee members. Up to five (5) non-affiliated student members can join SHAC if all twelve (12) affiliated student members are actively participating. If the number of endorsed student members drops below twelve early in the academic year, the Membership Admission Committee may allow more non-affiliated student members to join at its discretion.
